Cyprian, a convert from paganism, known for his writings on prayer, teaches us the importance of personal 'prayer of the heart' with God. On Wednesday, 6 June [2007], at the General Audience in St. Peter's Square, the Holy Father commented on St. Cyprian, the third-century Bishop of Carthage, focusing on his teachings of unity and prayer.
